Learning Across School

On Tuesday the **F2s** went into town for the afternoon to perform on stage at the Crucible Theatre with Polly and Music in the Round. They got very wet on the way there and back but that didn't dampen their spirits. They performed amazingly, well done to you all!

How exciting it is in **Y1!** On our first day back after the holidays we were launched into our new learning about space. We made helmets, a space passport and travelled to the moon in a rocket! We can't wait to see what else we learn.

Well it was such a delight to spend time with the **Y2** children before the holidays at

Whirlow. Both classes were so polite and a pleasure to take away. We had some amazing adventures and made lots of memories! We would also like to say a big well done to the children who did not go with us. Their teachers for the time their class were away said how lovely they had been. Well done to everyone!

Having written some fantastic stories inspired by the Saxon story of Beowulf, **Y4s** practised reading them dramatically to the class. The children created a rubric for what makes a good performance and critiqued each other in partners. They commented on use of voice (high, low, quiet, loud), actions and pauses to add tension.

It was amazing to see our children bringing their stories to life and encouraging each other to make them even better.

Y5s had a fantastic morning with our English lesson. Both classes spent all week before the holidays learning more about the Ancient Romans and their armies. After our visit to York we built on what we already knew about Roman Legionaries (a Roman soldier) and their roles, responsibilities and treatment. Some of the reasons we found were really positive, others made you wonder why anyone would want to be one! Then, we put all that information together and used it to plan debate points, even thinking about arguments and counter-arguments. With a bit of practice in our groups, we were ready for the real debate. The teachers were so proud of what the children achieved!

This term in PE the **Y6s** have been doing gymnastics. We have been practising how to move like a gymnast along with various activities. We needed to make a sequence that included: a roll, a plank, a balance, moving like a gymnast and a finish.

Spooky Cosy Read Update

The children and staff really enjoyed sharing books together and talking about the characters.
