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## Whirlow Residential

## Healthy Minds

We are happy to tell that our school will be involved in a joint project with Sheffield Children's and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) called Healthy Minds. Everyone involved in this project wants young people to flourish and fulfil their potential, and provide a school environment which best supports young people's emotional wellbeing. 45 schools across Sheffield are involved with this work over the next year.

Key activities offered within Healthy Minds are:

- Training for all school staff on the fundamentals of young people's mental health and the implications for learning.
- A Healthy Minds survey to be offered to students, families and staff to understand the specific needs of an individual school.
- Developing an action plan for each school based on its Healthy Minds survey. This will cover further training needs, development of PSHE materials or school protocols to further support young people's emotional wellbeing.
- Engage student voice through the development of Healthy Minds champions

- Provide clarity for staff, students and parents about who they can talk to if they are worried about a young person's mental health.
- Specialist mental health training for key staff in schools.
- Mental health consultation with key staff in schools.

The closing date for applying is 15<sup>th</sup> January 2018. You can contact admissions on 0114 2735766. Please ensure you put 3 school preferences down to ensure that if you don't get your first choice you have thought about where you want your child to go.

We must remind you that attendance at WCM Nursery does not guarantee you a place in school. This is worked out by the Local Authority based on distance from school.
