Learning Across School

This week in **F1** we have had a jungle scene and a jungle role play area where we have been pretending to be explorers and vets. The children have also been printing with bubble wrap to make animal print.

This half term in **F2** we are lucky to have Fay from Archers coming in to lead our PE lessons in dance. The children enjoyed dancing along to the music as different toys, teddy bears, robots etc. When the music stopped they had to look in the toy box (the hoop) for the next toy to dance as. We are looking forward to our next session on Friday.

In Y1 we have been starting the process of critiquing each others learning (looking at learning and saying what has been done well). We started this by drawing pictures to represent the 4 different seasons and then we looked at each other's pictures and wrote on postits things we thought had been done really well. We then take the good things we have seen and try to make our own learning even better. We will do this lots as we move through school.

This week in **Y2** we have been learning about basic needs of all living things.

We started imagining that we were going into space and discussed what we needed to survive. The children then decided on the three most important ones. We then made links to other animals and what they need to survive. One child started a great discussion point about what fish need and how they need water in a different way to us.

This week Y3 have had an exciting visit from world famous rock climber Steve McClure AKA Rockman. He came in and spoke to us about his rock climbing adventures as well as all the different types of rocks you can climb and their special features. We got to hold some of them and test our finger strength to see if we'd make good rock climbers.

The Y5s have been having some wonderful 'Being Brilliant' sessions with author and scientist Andy Cope. He taught us about a principle called 'hygge'. The word originates in Denmark and has no direct English translation. However, it is all to do with wellbeing, and Andy told us the best words to use were 'snuggliness, comfort and cosiness'. During the Monday morning session, we were asked to think of examples of 'hygge' for different seasons.

Y6 have enjoyed an afternoon of basketball with The Sheffield Sharks. It was great working alongside such talented people and learning new basketball skills. We also had a follow up session in the classroom where we discussed healthy food choices. We learnt lots of ways to eat well.
