Learning Across School

In F1 & F2 we are so excited that we have got some nice weather to start to properly enjoy our new outdoor area. The areas of



learning are all set up now and we have had some great activities out there. Check out our blog and have a look at what we are getting up to!

We were very lucky in **Y2** this week as we had a special visitor called Becky. She came in to talk to us about what makes Kenya special as part of our new topic. She also showed us some of the differences between Nairobi and Sheffield, which was very interesting! We will be doing more learning about this as the term goes on.

This week **Y3** have been learning all about equivalent fractions. We have been using lots of practical equipment to explore and find different fractions with the same value.

Before the holidays in **Y5** in light of the learning we have done on maps, orienteering in PE and about the London landmarks in our writing lessons, we went down to Hillsborough. Each class was taken on a guided tour of the landmarks by Mr Hiron and Miss Eden. We stopped by Hillsborough Leisure Centre, the Cadbury/Bassetts factory, Owlerton Stadium, the Barracks and the Walled Garden in Hillsborough Park, whilst the teachers did their best tour guide impression! The tour was good, but the orienteering session run by Pauline in the park was the best. We were finally able to consolidate all of the skills that we learnt in PE and we did ourselves proud. Each pair used maps to orientate themselves around the park and find the controls. It was made even more fun as each pair also had an electronic dibber! They even got a print out of their times! What was equally as impressive was how resilient they were for running all over the park for an hour, particularly as we walked 5 miles that day in total! It was great practice for London.
