Learning Across School

This week in **F1** we have been reading Jack and the Beanstalk. The children had to listen really carefully because the teachers told the story without a book! We acted out the story in the small world play. On the creative table we used blue and yellow powder paints to mix various shades of green to make a beanstalk.

F2s had a lovely visit to the Botanical Gardens. We went on a Bear Hunt. We saw autumn leaves, squirrels and we found the BEAR! What a beautiful day! We are very proud of our little ones, they were super! The bus driver on the way home said we were the best group of school children he had ever had on his bus!

In **Y1** we have been doing some history learning. We looked at a variety of objects and placed them on a time line. Some of the objects were easier than others. We will practice this in different ways.

During our Stone Age experience day, we had a real fire. Today some children from **Y3** went and collected some charcoal left over from the fire and we used it to do some cave art! We made some great pictures that you can see on our blog.

Just a quick update on our times tables challenge for **Y4s** – we're trying out Times Tables Rockstars at the moment with great success! Each child has their own login and they play different tournaments to improve their speed and accuracy.

Applying for a Secondary School Place

If you have not already done so, then this half term is the time to apply for a place for your child at secondary school for September 2019. You can do this online at www.sheffield.gov.uk/pupiladmissions or by filling in a paper form (you can request one of these by phoning Secondary Admissions on **0114 2735790**). For either application you will need your

child's unique reference number, which is on the letter you should have received from Sheffield City Council back in July. For an online application, you will also need a current email address. Applications close at the end of October. You will be informed of your child's allocated place at the beginning of **March 2019**. If you have any questions about this or would like help with making an application then speak to one of the Y6 team.

Applications are now open for places in Reception for September 2019. You should have received your pack through the post.
