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Learning Across School

Our traditional tale this week in **Nursery** was Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We had real porridge with different sized bowls and spoons to act out the story. We had great fun trying to use our voices like Daddy, Mummy, and Baby Bear.

F2 will be performing at the Crucible Theatre in November with Music in the Round and last Friday, Ester came in to teach us the songs and the actions. We are performing a story called Giddy Goat. It is all about a mountain goat that is scared of heights. The children did great singing.

In **Y1** we have been busy focussing on our sentence formation and making sure we add in a full stop and start with a capital letter. We are thinking carefully about making sure we always use finger spaces. We are very proud of our writing, call in to class and look in our books.

We have been so busy in **Y2!** In our writing we have been learning about writing instructions, we even made a film about it. Circle Time was about sharing ideas around what makes everyone feel happy in class and around WCM. Then to top it off we filled our "Jar of Good Choices" and as a reward had a chocolate fountain. Life in Y2 is amazing!

In **Y3** we have been busy critiquing a letter ready for our letter writing next week. We've been saying what we liked about the WAGOLL (what a good one looks like) to help us understand what to put into our writing. We are looking forward to writing our own letters!

Last week the **Y4s** had a visit from the Friends of Parkwood Springs. The visitors came into school to make parts for a lantern that should have been on display at the Lantern Procession on Saturday at Parkwood Springs. Each child made their own petal using willow and tissue paper. The petals were put together to make a flower from all the Y4 children. We were so disappointed when the procession was cancelled due to the bad weather but our lantern did look amazing.

In **Y5** Maths, we continued our learning about statistics. The children were learning how to read and interpret a line graph. After brilliant listening, the children put these skills into practice and attempted to solve a range of really tricky questions.

They had to use a graph to find specific information. Their maths skills were truly put to the test, as they had to use a range of operations to solve their questions.

In **Y6** maths this week we have been working on factors and multiples – this has shown clearly that those children who do not know their times tables are at a distinct disadvantage to access this learning. Next week we will be beginning fraction work and again it is essential that key times tables facts are known.

Anti-Idling Campaign

We have been asked by the council to share this message with you:

We are urging all schools across Sheffield to encourage parents and carers to turn off their engines when waiting for their child(ren). From the 8th October fixed penalty notices will be issued for idling engines on the roads surrounding 21 schools in Sheffield. This will be rolled out to 20 further schools in the coming months. We will contact you before your area is affected by enforcement action.

The emissions that come from vehicle exhausts are harmful for everyone, especially children who breathe more and at a faster rate than adults and whose health will be permanently damaged.
