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Learning Across School

This week in **F1** we have been learning about the Arctic. We had a story about all the animals that live there called "Say Hello to the Snowy Animals". Attendance

We currently have 157 children that are on target to hit 100% attendance with only 2 weeks to go and a further 143 that are on target to achieve 96% or above.
