

Learning Across School

This week in **F1** we have been making snowflake patterns. We used gems, cotton wool, match sticks, white circles and cotton buds to make our patterns. Some children copied pictures of patterns and some made their own up.

In **F2** we had a PE session with 2 visitors, Rebecca and Rebecca from the Archers. They were so impressed with how we listened and followed their instructions. We had lots of fun being pirates. We have also been very busy learning how to write lists, Santa will be so impressed when he gets letters from all our children.

In **Y1** we have been busy learning about Space, we went on a visit to the moon with our passports and space helmets. We also had a visitor into school. Tim Peake, the famous astronaut, came in to answer all our questions. We learnt so many facts about him and what life in space is like.

In **Y2** we have had a science focus around investigating the properties of different materials. We carried out tests and investigations to see which materials were waterproof. This is all linked to our learning about the Titanic and the best type of clothes to wear on board the boat.

This week in **Y3**, we are finishing off recounts of our fantastic trip to Creswell Crags. We've spent today learning how to edit and improve writing so are now working in pairs to do this in our writing. We've worked really hard to include time adverbs, correct spellings and conjunctions.

All the staff in Y3 are so proud of how much we've improved already since the beginning of the year!

Students from Sheffield University joined the **Y4s** this week and last week to talk about Watercliffe Thursday Green 'Un Page 1

food waste. We learned about the crazy amount of food that is thrown away each week and found ways of reducing this waste. The children created shopping lists and planned out meals in order to buy only what they needed. They also planted broad beans to take home. Has anyone's sprouted yet?

In Y5, having now built up our knowledge of using primary and secondary sources and how to use them to learn about the past, we used this skill again in a different context. Last week, we were trying to find out all about the Ancient Greek Olympics following our pictorial predictions the week before. To begin the task, the children worked in groups to try and reform an Ancient Greek vase. From putting the image together we were able to immediately identify some events that took place. These included, chariot racing, javelin, running and discus. It is great finding things out from sources in this way.

In **Y6** we are just trying to master the skill of learning how to multiply, divide add and subtract fractions. It is a bit tricky but we are determined to master it. If you are struggling take a look at our blog page for some help.
