## Learning Across School

We are really enjoying our phonics learning at the minute in **F1**. We spend time together every day segmenting and blending sounds in words. We love playing all the different games. This is so important as it is teaching the very early stages of reading.

We have been learning about Chinese New Year in **F2**. We have found out it is the 'Year of the Pig'. We have learned that red is a lucky colour. We have tried some Chinese food for snack too, it was lovely! We can also sing a New Year song.

In **Y1** we working really hard on our writing skills and concentrating on what makes a good sentence. We have been using our phonics to segment words for spelling and making sure we leave finger spaces so it is easier to read every word.

We are well on our way to producing our newspaper article in **Y3**. We're currently writing paragraphs about how King Tut's tomb was discovered. We had a visit from Howard Carter on Tuesday.

We're concentrating on writing full paragraphs and using lots of time adverbs and specific key words. We also went out last Wednesday - what an amazing, fun filled day we had with our linking school, Arbourthorne.

We had a welcome assembly, a tour around the school and then some time outside! We then did some art activities around friendship and got together in the hall for a bit of Go Noodle!

We can't wait to stay in touch with our new friends and show them our school!

This week in maths in **Y4** we have been learning about fractions. We have made a fraction wall and been learning how to find equivalent fractions from it. In our writing we have been writing and editing a story that has a problem in it. Some of our stories have involved the theft of all toys and some have had the loss of electricity. We have been gathering ideas for this from our story frame sessions on Friday.

In **Y5** we are into our third week of learning and applying our knowledge of reading four-figure grid references on OS maps. This information helps us locate places, by name or by the appropriate map symbol. We have been looking at things such as where the phone box would be, etc.

Over the last two weeks, the children have studied parts of Ordnance Survey maps for Sheffield and London. The children got very excited when they found places near where they lived and the landmarks we have been learning about! We even created a WAGOLL for this week, so the children could try and read the grid references more securely.

We have been busy bees in **Y6**. During maths, we have continued looking at algebra. The children carried on working hard AND enjoyed it! They have shown us a surprising amount of resilience in such a tricky maths topic.

We have continued to look at our 'mythical' creature in writing. The creature must 'conform' to nature's 'laws' – in other words, a penguin won't live in the rain forest! In PE, the children have continued to develop their dance with Jack and they have developed their own fitness program.

We have also continued to look at Charles Darwin in theme and his fascinating life! Last Wednesday, we had some very special visitors to our school. Lots of 'wild' creatures from all over the world. We saw: stick insects, snakes, frogs, tortoise and a turtle, chinchilla and a lovely little mouse.
