Children in Y4 have bounced back into learning this term with a focus on how we can reduce environmental impact of our actions! Look out for our findings over the term!

In **Y5**, we have been really enjoying reading our guided reading text. Last week, we got through a few more chapters of the book and had some excellent discussions. One of the things we did was to help Miss Eden create a diagram that summarised the main places (the underworld and Earth) and characters of the story. We also did our usual thing of discussing vocabulary we liked and found the word 'cacophony'. We learnt this to mean a lot of sounds at the same time that don't sound nice together.

What a fantastic experience a group of **Y6** children had the last Friday before the holidays. We participated in a lively debate against Emmaus school at the Town Hall in Sheffield about whether phones should or should not be allowed in schools – we argued against. Unfortunately, slightly more children voted that they should be allowed in school. However, this didn't prevent all six children having a brilliant morning.
