Learning Across School

Our role play area in **Nursery** for the last 2 weeks has had a camping/ holiday theme.

The children have really enjoyed cooking on the bbq and pretending to sleep in the tent. We are practicing for when we get to Y3 and go camping to Bakewell!

In **Y1** we have been investigating some poo that Mrs Morton found in her garden (obviously not real poo!) We wanted to find out what kind of animal it was from. We found bones, skin and lots of seeds. It was very interesting!

In **Y3** we have been looking at the properties of 3D shapes and then using this information to make 3D shapes with modelling clay and straws. Some of us found it harder than others!

Y4 had a fantastic time at the Yorkshire Wildlife Park on Friday! We spent the morning looking at all of the animals, learning more about their habitats and behaviour. The baboons in particular were such fun to watch as they stole food from each other and jumped around. After lunch, we had a workshop about endangered species and how to conserve them. It was really interesting to discover why so many animals are becoming extinct and we are all more aware now of how to look after them.

In between all the excitement around the play, the **Y6** children have also been busy preparing for secondary school. They are off spending time in a number of different Secondary Schools across Sheffield becoming familiar with their new surroundings. We hope they have a great time and spread the WCM specialness!
