Reducing Plastic

In Community Week last year our Y4 children were learning about our environment, and in particular they looked at how we can reduce the use of single use plastic and other waste in our school, our homes, our local community and in our city.

In support of this, as a school we have introduced jugs of squash at social times and fruit juice in our breakfast clubs instead of plastic cuplets and cartons with plastic straws. Children can pay 20p for a beaker of squash or fruit juice, or they can bring their own reusable bottle to be filled.

After half term, we will no longer be selling cartons at all, and this will be the only option for drinks. We are also hoping to obtain some water bottles that children can buy from school to reuse.

Applying for a Secondary School Place

If you have not already done so, then this half term is the time to apply for a place for your child at secondary school for September 2020. You can do this online at www.sheffield.gov.uk/pupiladmissions or by filling in a paper form (you can request one of

these by phoning Secondary Admissions on **0114 2735790**). Applications close at the end of October.

Applying for a Reception School Place

Applications for a place in Reception September 2020 are now being accepted. If you do not complete a form or apply online you will not be offered a place at a Sheffield school. Places are not "reserved" at your catchment area school. Forms need to be completed by **15th January 2019**.

Remember if your child is in our Nursery it does not guarantee you a place in school so please make sure you apply on time.

Nursery Places

If you have a child at home who is not yet three years old please make sure you register them for Nursery. Once you have filled in the form just drop it back to school and the Nursery staff will contact you to arrange a home visit, usually within the term of their 3rd birthday.

We now offer 30 hours for families that are eligible, please ask in the office for more information.
