Learning Across School

This week in F1 we have been practising our tripod grip. We have been writing thank you letters to Sam's Safari for bringing in the animals to show us. We used our phonics to work out the initial sound in words, like 's' for snake. We also drew pictures of the animals we saw and talked about why we liked them and which ones were our favourite.

In F2 we are continuing our learning about the Arctic and Antarctic and have been busy learning facts and talking about things that are the same and different in the different parts of the world. Did you know that the Arctic is sea surrounded by land and Antarctic is land surrounded by sea?

In Y1 we have been looking at the past and present in our History focus. Have you seen the photos of teachers outside our classroom, there are some funny ones! Our science focus has been around materials and we have been investigating which materials are the best to make a house for the three little pigs. We have looked at how strong materials are and if they are waterproof!

In Y2 Circle Time we spoke about what the word gratitude meant. We shared all of the things that we are grateful for such as our eyes so that we can see, our beds so that we have somewhere comfy to sleep and our families. We know that there is always something to be thankful for and always someone less fortunate than us. This is a very tricky concept to understand but we were so impressed with how the children could share ideas. Look out in our classrooms for our gratitude jars.

This week in Y3 Maths we are working with money, adding different amounts together and working out change. This is not as easy as it sounds and the children had to concentrate to ensure they counted accurately. Just a shame all this money wasn't real, we could have had great fun shopping!

In Y4 we are still trying to keep our recycling campaign going strong. This week we are ordering bins to use for recycling, we will put one outside Y6 and the other outside Y4. We will let you know when these arrive. Have you noticed there is less single use plastic being used in the café? This is because we now use juice from jugs and fill up plastic reusable bottles. Thank you to the café staff for helping us do more to save our environment.
