

#### **Christmas Cards**

It's a bit early to be thinking of Christmas we know, but we are sending home with your child a sheet for your child to design a Christmas Card, that you can then purchase to send to your family and friends. The cards are printed on good quality card, with your child's design on the front, a Christmas greeting on the inside, and a section on the back that says "Design Created by.....(your child's name)" and also our school name.

The packs of 12 cards cost £5.50 to purchase. You can also purchase gift tags, mugs, wrapping paper or a bumper pack of cards/labels/wrapping paper for £20. Every item that you order helps us to raise valuable money for our School Fund.

This year all orders are placed online. You will need to return the completed artwork form to school as usual with your child's design by Wednesday 21st October. ### **Learning Across School**

This week in **F1** we have enjoyed learning around Goldilocks and the Three Bears! We have really enjoyed the porridge that we had for snack time and also enjoyed playing with the porridge oats, bowls and spoons. In the role play area, we have had the bears and bowls so we can learn about small, medium and large.

The children really enjoyed being outside this week, now that it is Autumn, they have been looking for the different coloured leaves and have really enjoyed running around in the wind.

There are monsters about in **F2** this week! We are reading Not Now Bernard, it is a great book about a little boy who finds a monster in his garden but his mum and dad are too busy to listen to him! We have been making monsters of our own, even in the play dough! Keep your eye open, you never know where a monster might be hiding!

In maths in **Y1** we have been learning to partition numbers and find different parts of numbers. Alongside this we have been learning our number bonds to 10. These skills will be really useful when we move on to harder maths learning.

Friday in **Y2** was very exciting! We had so many different activities for Golden Time...it is very exciting. Here is what we got up to. Special dance time with Jack, scooters, the top yard trim trail and sports games with Arches. It is certainly worth following our Golden Rules in school.

In Y3 science this week we have been looking and learning about fossils. We learnt about how they are formed and what we can learn from them. We even managed to make some of our own using clay! Do you know how fossils are made? If not come along and ask someone in Y3!

As part of our **Y4** PE, we designed our own fitness lesson activity. The ideas ranged from planning fitness circuits to games that incorporated fitness. The children listed exercises that we have used in lessons that they were going to include such as jumping jacks, arch holds, arm circles and jogging. Some groups also their own activities to the list – wall sits and burpees. The ones chosen were a mixture of static (one movement that is held for an amount of time) and dynamic exercises (more than one movement). It is a certainty that the lesson would be meet the requirement of the getting the children's hearts beating and make them feel warmer and

slightly out of breath! They will definitely be burning fat and building muscle over time.

This week in **Y5** we have started our 3 week block on Roman Britain. Today, the children have used a range of historical images and information to explain how the Romans changed Britain. The Roman legacy is absolutely immense! For sure, they changed the face of history across Europe and here in Britain. The children made some wonderful historical connections! Mr Tompkinson and Mr Boynton were very proud of what the children produced.

On the 14th of October for **Y6KH** and the 21st October for **Y6MB** we have an artist coming in to work with us. We will be creating a piece of artwork together based on our lockdown experiences. ## 10 Day Active Travel Challenge

For either application you will need your child's unique reference number, which is on the letter you should have received from Sheffield City Council back in July. For an online application, you will also need a current email address. Applications

close at the end of October. You will be informed of your child's allocated place at the beginning of **March 2021**. If you have any questions about this or would like help with making an application then speak to one of the Y6 team.
