In **Y1** we have had a special visitor who has been doing art work with us. We are making a banner to go on the bottom corridor. Once it is finished, we will post it on our Blog!

This week as part of Togetherness Week we have been designing and printing tiles to create a **Y2** 'flag'. We had to create a design in sketch books, then transfer it onto tracing paper, then transfer it onto a polystyrene tile! Then we needed to use special printing ink and a roller to press the design onto fabric. It was great fun!

This week in **Y3**, we have been creating designs for our Togetherness Week mosaic that we will be completing in the final week of half term.

We each created our own version of a flying rainbow and we will use them altogether to go over the entrance of school. We can't wait for them to be up!

In **Y4** we have made dreamcatchers.

Dreamcatchers are said to be a tool to help give the dreamer good dreams by catching bad thoughts and only letting positive ones shine through. We are going to keep them as an installation in school when we have made them to keep the positivity flowing. By Tuesday, the Y4s had worked in groups to use coloured wool and feathers that reflect our feelings of lockdown, in addition to stating words that we think of when we discuss the positivities of the current times. We then went on to make our very own dreamcatchers...it was a great experience.

On Wednesday in **Y5**, as part of our Togetherness Week we had a visit from Artist John. Our task for the day was to create self-portraits in the style of Andy Warhol. We loved using Sharpies and acrylic paint to create our designs, the finished designs were stunning and will be appearing on the Y5 blog soon!

In **Y6** we have worked with a visiting artist – Sarah Jane Palmer. We talked about the things that we enjoyed doing during lockdown. We drew around our hands and filled the outline with our lockdown activities, thoughts and feelings.

These are being taken away to be colourised and stuck onto a cornflower to create one larger piece of art. We also started sticking lockdown images onto the stems and leaves.
